

I think I mentioned on the phone when you called me, the use is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and a designated Penfield Landmark. It was purchased by Gary Lehmann from Seeler Construction Co. which built the subdivisions on either side of Whalen Road.

Benjamin Tripp was an overseer of the poor at the time this area was named Northfield and continued in that post at the first town meeting of Penfield held April 2, 1811. He lived on a farm on Penfield Road where the Harris Hill school is now located.

Lyman Tripp was born in Saratoga and came here in 1803..married Betsey whose father was a blacksmith (Samuel Bennett). Their sons were Amasa and Bennett L.

Ebenezer and Naomi had Rebecca who married William Gors., Sarah who married Stephen O. Moore, Zilpha who married a man by the name of Bennett, Alzina, wife of Pascal Taylor and Fidelia, wife of William Hannah.
