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PROVIDED a den for which Embrey made floor-to-ceiling shelves for his library. The kitchen, which like every other room has windows with sills 18 inches deep (the depth of the mud forms), has an old fashioned look with red brick wallpaper and a very old re-finished pine kitchen set.

Also, as time went on, plumbing, electricity and a hot water heating system was put into the house. "One of the hardest things, though," says Embrey. "The house was built without closets." And so Embrey has improvised, building out along one

wall of the large upstairs bedroom a long closet with sliding doors.

"And then notice all the antique trunks we have around. We refinished them so they're

attractive and give us storage place at the same time," he says.
